This academic Year 2017- 2018 the planned spend of the Sport Premium is to explore and improve the quality of teaching across the waking day curriculum. The proposal is for St Dominic's School to use the funding gain access into the Youth Sports Trust at a Level 3 membership and gain a Quality Mark of Silver above. This would show a nationally recognised accreditation that we have the health and wellbeing at the heart of our learners.

Having access to the Youth Sports Trust means, we can have a wider range of CPD opportunities for staff working in the Physical Education Department. Furthermore, we can develop other key members of staff within the school setting to have a greater understanding of Physical Education and to gain an understanding of what it means for pupils to be physically literate. The school with membership will have access to online resources giving examples and ideas of best practice in Physical Education.

Additionally, the school will receive consultancy visits from the Youth Sports Trust to advice and ensure best practice is delivered. The membership will allow use a place at the Youth Sport National Conference giving further CPD development for staff.

In addition, the Physical Education Department are exploring the possibility of funding and developing a 3G artificial pitch to replace the current pitch. This would affect upon the whole school and develop physical literacy across the waking day and residential curriculum.
